EXTRACT FROM REGULATION -

Article 1: The competition is open to all lawyers registered with a bar, irrespective of their nationality or age.

Article 3: Candidates must write a speech for the defence in French or English relating to a genuine, individual case of human rights' violation, taken from recent current affairs and proof of which must be provided and will be strictly required (internet, newspaper, etc.).

Article 4: The objective of the competition is to make a 12-minute speech for the defence, in front of a jury and a public. Speaking over the time limit would be unfavorable.

Article 11: Pleadings written in English

will be translated into French. Translation is provided by professional translators. The translation cost will be borne by the Caen Mémorial.

Article 16: The candidates shall be judged on the subject matter (individual and real case), soundness of their arguments, strength of conviction, their oratorical skill and keeping to the time limit.

Article 19: The Caen Mémorial museum shall see to organising and paying for the finalists' travel and accommodation expenses (transport, meals and 3 nights in a hotel in Caen for the finalists). All other expenses, including visa costs, airport taxes, insurance and additional hotel nights, shall be borne by the finalists.



































A forum for human rights
